

# Christian Simplicity: A Gospel Value

Meeting Mar. 2–Apr. 13

Imagine the earth divided equally among all of us. Each person would receive 4.5 acres. Now imagine that everything you need must come from those 4.5 acres. But it takes 22.3 acres to maintain the average American lifestyle. This year we will be observing Lent in a new way that helps us as individuals to care for God's creation by taking steps toward using only our fair share of its resources. Moving in the direction of 4.5 is essential for following Jesus and cultivating the gospel value of greater simplicity.

#### Features of LENT 4.5

- All members and friends of CPC are encouraged to participate for **7 weeks** from March 2 to April 13 in a once-a-week **small group** of 10-12 people. The groups will meet at church or in people's homes to discuss topics related to caring for the creation. Sign ups will begin on February 2.
- Rev. Kim Rogers will **train the small group facilitators. Childcare** will be provided for groups meeting at the church.
- The **small group study guide** is a booklet entitled Christian Simplicity: a Gospel Value. It will be available for \$13.00. It consists of short readings and discussion starters to stimulate conversation and faith sharing, as well as point participants toward considering changes in their personal lifestyle.

- Each Sunday from March 2 to April 13, our pastors will preach on the Lent 4.5 topics:
  - ♦ Week of March 2: Christian Simplicity: Compassionate Living
  - ♦ Week of March 9 1st Sunday of Lent Food: Buying and Eating are Moral Acts
- ♦ Week of March 16 2nd Sunday of Lent Consumption: Buying Less, Wasting Less
- ♦ Week of March 23 3rd Sunday of Lent Water: Conserving and Protecting
- ♦ Week of March 30 4th Sunday of Lent Energy: Choosing Efficient and Clean
- ♦ Week of April 6 5th Sunday of Lent Transportation: Getting from Here to There
- ♦ Week of April 13 6th Sunday of Lent Gratitude and Generosity: Becoming Involved
- Middle and High School Youth will be included
- 9:45 am Youth and Adult Sunday Classes will be suspended during Lent, although a small group option will be available at that time. Regular Sunday Classes will resume after Easter.

### **Liturgist Training**


Led by Rev. George Holland, retired PC(USA) pastor Meeting Jan. 5–Jan. 26 in **The Sanctuary**
